

## **ABOUT US**

Bold Voices was founded on the belief that all young people have the right to receive an education free from gender inequality and gender-based violence.

It is up to us as educators and leaders within our community to ensure that the next generation are better equipped than we were to challenge these cultures.



#### **WHAT WE SEE**

At **Bold Voices** we work with schools across the UK who are grappling with what it means to keep young people safe within a society that trivialises, normalises and dismisses gender inequality and gender-based violence as "just the way things are".

Through our work in schools we notice that girls and young people of marginalised genders experience high levels of sexual harassment and violence but often remain silent, boys experience disproportionate struggles with mental health and are often unable to talk about the pressures they face, and across school communities we find gendered and sexist language, misogynistic views and a general silencing of these issues.




To combat these issues our approach is to equip school communities with the knowledge and skills to understand this culture and challenge it.

At its foundation this means creating spaces in which transformative conversations can be held. We encourage and nurture critical thinking, open discussion, and bringing pupils, staff and parents together with a collective understanding that this is a culture we all contribute to and all have a responsibility to challenge.



# NURTURING **EQUALITY FESTIVAL**

**Bold Voices** ran the NEF in collaboration with students from Bryanston and The Blandford School, with the aim to raise awareness about gender equality and the harmful impact of stereotypes.

The festival included workshops led by 28 Sixth Form ambassadors and over 75 Year 6 students from nine primary schools participated in the day. The workshops encouraged pupils to learn about, discuss and challenge gender inequality.





## AMBASSADOR PROGRAMME

The Ambassador Programme 2022-23 saw over **150 Reps** from **19 schools** join together to learn about, discuss and tackle gender inequality and gender-based violence in their local communities.




We asked Student Reps how confident they would feel organising a project to raise awareness for a specific gendered issue in school

because they don't want people close to them see their vulnerable side. "It was the first time our school has acknowledged sexual assault without "hiding" words or sugar coating it." LGBT+ young people are 2x more likely to contemplate suicide, and Black LGBT+ young people are 3x more likely. "Topics that were discussed were things that I thought no one else would talk about in public, e.g. porn and female sexual pleasure." FTSE 350 largest companies listed on the London Stock Exchange showed 96% of CEOs are men. "It was brilliant how Bold Voices defined this as a conversation. NOT BOLDER VOICES MAKE BIGGER CHANGE victims of domestic monocide are less likely to be previously known to the police and other agencies than white victims. "The Bold Voices team encouraged us to have a voice and explained that we are more powerful than we think." Over 1,600 cases of alleged sexual offences and domestic alvinvolving its Met police staff are being reviewed. "The workshop was fabulous and so so beneform in a way that is considerate and respectful of possible survivors." Nearly 1/2 of 16-21 years assume girls either "expect" or "enjoy" sex which involves physical aggression, such as restriction. "I thought Andrew Tate was good but I realised what he does and all the hate a women." 91% of LGBT+ students have heard negative language about their identity in the past year.
